Watershed Planning and Advisory Council Summit

Alberta's 11 Watershed Planning and Advisory Councils (WPACs) met in Drumheller in October to share watershed management highlights. Red Deer River Watershed Alliance was the host this year, and representatives from the Government of Alberta were also in attendance. Battle River Watershed Alliance presented on our newly released State of the Watershed Report and shared information on our two new education programs - Waste in our Watershed Wetaskiwin (for grade 4), and the Habitat Tour (for grade 6).

Fun Fact: BRWA was recognized among the WPACs for their longstanding, dedicated staff. Past General Manager David Samm was recognized for being one of the longest retained Managers,

and Sarah Skinner, Sheila Logelin and Susanna Bruneau were recognized for being with BRWA for more than 10 years!
